COVERAGE INFORMATION

Bertazzoni SpA will repair or replace any component part which fails or proves defective due to materials and/or workmanship within 2 years from the date of installation and under conditions of normal residential use. Repair or replacement will be free of charge, including labor at standard rates and shipping expenses. Repair service must be performed by a Bertazzoni Authorized Service Center during normal working hours.

COSMETIC WARRANTY

Bertazzoni will cover parts showing cosmetic defects in material and workmanship for a period of thirty (30) days from date of installation of the unit. This coverage will include scratches, stains, surface imperfections on stainless steel, paint and porcelain, with the exclusion of slight differences in color due to materials and painting/enamelling technologies. Exclusions are labor costs, B stock items, out - of - box appliances and display units.

- Water supply temperature should be 120 For 149 F.
- Dispose of the discarded appliance and packing material properly.


 Load sharp items and knives so that they are not likely to damage the door seal and tub.


Your dishwasher has a multiple Filte System .Inthe System there are four filter-meshes .It can separate soiled water and clean water in different chambers.


The multiple filter system helps your dishwasher to get better performance with less water and less energy.



Smart Wash System

Your dishwasher has Smart Wash System. When apartial load of lightly soiled dishes is placed in theunit, a wash cycle similar to a short wash willautomatically be performed. When a full load of heavily soiled dishes is placed in the unit, a heavywash cycle wil automatically be performed. Can determine the type of cycle required to clean the dishes and will clean more efficiently every time.





Features of your new dishwasher

How your dishwasher cleans

Your dishwasher cleans by spraying a mixture ofhot water and detergent through the spray arms against soiled surfaces.

The dishwasher fills with water covering the filterarea. Water is then pumped through the multiple filter and spray arms. Separated soil particles go down the drain as the water is pumped out and replaced with clean water.

The number of water fills will vary with the cyclebeing used.

Getting Started

- 1.Load dishwasher (See preparing and loading dishes).
- 2.Add detergent (See Fill detergent to the dispenser).
- 3.Add rinse aid, if needed (See Fill rinse to dispenser).
- 4.Select desired CYCLE (See Cycle Chart). The indicator light that b eside the pad will glow whenselected.
- 5. Select desired FUNCTIONS, the indicator light that b eside the pad will glow when selected.
- 6. To start, press Start/Cancel(See Start/Cancel)pad.
- 7.Close the door, then the machine will start to work.

Note:


- 1. Your dishwasher has the top control panel. The door should be opened first if you want to operate the machine.
- 2.To start a cycle, the door must be closed within 4s after press Start/ Cancle.

Wash Cycle Selections

Cycle times are approximate and will vary with options Selected. Hot water is necessary to activate dishwasher detergent and melt fatty food soils.

An automatic sensor will check the incoming water temperature and if it is not hot Enough, the timer will be delayed for automatic water heating in the main wash of all Cycles. This happens even when HI-TEMP WASH is selected an even higher temperature will be guaranteed to handle heavier soil loads.

Wash Cycle Selections

1 Display Window

To display the remained hours and minutes of the running cycle, delayhours and error codes etc.

2 CYCLES

With the dishwasher door open, you can press the CYCLES button to select the wash cycle. A light onthe display will in dicate which cycle has been selected.

3 AUTO

This cycle is sen sing wash, lightly, norm ally or heavily soiled crockery, with or without dried-on food.

4 HEAVY

This cycle is for pots, pans, casse roles and dinnerware

5 REGULAR

This cycle is for regularly soiled din ner dishes or

6 ECO

This cycle is for light solied or pre-rinsed dishes and sliverware.

7 QUICK

This cycle is for lightly soiled loads.

8 RINSE

This cycle is for pre-rinsing dishes or glasses. This is only a rinse that keeps food from drying on your dishes and reduces odor buildup in your dishwasher until you are ready to wash a full load. Do not use detergent.

9 POWER ZONE

Use this option when you want to wash pots and pans, durable serving bowls, and other large, very dirty, hard to clean dishes.

Touse use POWER ZONE, place the dishes face down in the lower rack directly above the vortex wash arm I n the back left corner

10 EXTRADRY

When the "Heated Dry" function is selected, the heater will work during the drying process.

11 HIGHTEMP

When the "Hi Temp wash" Function is selected, the temperature of water will be maintained at $60^{\circ}C(140^{\circ}F)$ max.

12 SANI BOOST

To sanitize your dishes and the Sanitize option. when the "anitize" function is selected, the temperature of water will be maintained at $70^{\circ}\text{C}(158^{\circ}\text{F})$ max.

Note: It is possible that 70° C (158°F) may not be reached, if the temperature of the incoming hot water dose not reach the suggested temperature.

13 CHILD LOCK

You can lock all controls to prevent children from accidently changing the dishwasher cycle or starting the dishwasher.

Press the "SANI BOOST" and the "DELAY START" simultaneity to select or cancel the function. After the function is selected and the corresponding indicator light will turn on.

14 DELAY START

To delay the start of a selected cycle, open the door, press the Delay Start pad until the desired delay time shows in the LED displayscreen, it allows you to start

your dishwasherfor 1 to 24 hours delay. Press the START/CANCEL pad, and then you should close the door within 4 seconds, then the delay function is running.

To cancel the Delay Start function and begin the cycle. Before the delay period is over, open the door and press the START/CANCEL pad for 3 seconds.

Functions



15 START CANCEL

Open the door, select a wash cycle that you desired, the indicator light beside the pad will turn on. Press the START/CANCEL pad, you should close the door within 4 seconds, then the selected program light begins to glitter and the cycle progress indicator in the front of the door will light on, the washing cycle is running.

If you close the door more than 4 seconds afterpressed the START/CANCEL pad, the cycle will pause and not run.

To change a running cycle, you can open the door and press the START/CANCEL pad for 3seconds. The display screen will show "60", then press the START/CANCEL pad for 3seconds again, the display screen will show "-:--", you can selcet the desired cycle. Close the door within 4s then the dishwasher will work again.

When you want to load more dishes or pause the dishwasher while it is already running, make sure to open the door slowly and carefully as there is a possibility of injury from the hot steam inside the dishwasher. You can add more dishes before the main wash Starts.open the door and check the detergent Dispenser. If the main wash Section of the detergent dispenser is still closed. you can add items. If the door is opened while the dishwasher is running, a safety mechanism is activated and stops the cycle.

16 SANITIZED indicator light If a cycle with the sanitize function is finished, the sanitized indicator light turns on.

If you open the door, it will turn off after 30 seconds another possible, it will turn off immediately if you have any operation.

17 RINSE AID indicator light Turns on when the dishwasher needs to add Rinse aid.

18 END indicator light
Turns on after a cycle finished.
If you open the door, it will turn off after
30 seconds, and another possible, it will
turn off immediately if you haveany operation.

Status Window

H:01- H:24 If the Delay Start option is selected, the number of delay start hours shows in the status window.

2:15-0:00 After the machine works, the remaining time of the cycle that have been selected will be showed in the Status Window.

NOTE

The rema ining time could suddenly increase or drop several minutes. This means the Smart Sensor has checked the soil level and determined if additional water fills are needed or if water fills can be deleted.

Error indication

In certain situations which are critical to the machines function and safe operation, the control shall shut down and indicate an errorcode (See Error Codes on page 18).

If Error codes ar e displayed, contact the dealer or servicer. They will be able to provide assistance in trouble shooting the problem and or locate anauthorized service technician if needed.

Adjustable Upper Rack

The upper rack height can be easily adjusted to accommodate loading taller dishes in either rack.

To accommodate taller dishes in the bottom rack, there are 2 positions available:







Dish Preparation

Scrape away large pieces of food, bones, pits, toothpicks, etc.

The continuous filtered wash system will remove the remaining food particles. Burned-on foods should be loosened before loading. Empty liquids from glasses and cups. Foods such as mustard, mayonnaise, vinegar, lemonjuice and tomato based products may cause discoloration of stainless steel and plastics if allowed to sit for a long period of time. Unless the dishwasher is to be opertated at once it is best to rinse off these food soils. If the dishwasher drains into a food disposer, be sure disposer is completely empty before starting dishwasher.





Note:

Height should be adjusted without dishes in the racks.

Loading the Upper Rack

The upper rack is designed for cups, glasses, small plates, bowls and plastic items marked safe etc.

For best results, place the bowls, cups, glasses, sauce pans with soiled surface facing down or toward thecenter. Tilt slightly for better drainage.



Make sure the loaded dishes do not interfere with the rotation of the middle spray arm, which is located at the bottom of the upper rack. (Check this by rotating the middle spray arm by hand.)

Loading the Bottom Rack

The bottom rack is designed to load plates, soup bow Is, plates, saucers and cookware. The adjustable rackspace will allow you to load maximum 13 inch items.

The fold-down tines in the bottom rack make it easy to load those extra large and hard-to-f it items. The tines may be left up for normal use or folded down for more flexible loading. Fold down for more space to load large pots or pans.



Large items should be placed along the edge so they do not interfere with the middle spray arm rotation, and make sure they not preventthe detergent dispenser from opening. Large items should be turned so that the inside faces downward, and make sure these items do not interfere with the lower sprayarm rotation.

Loading the Cutlery Rack

Cutlery should be placed in the cutlery rack separatelyfrom each other in the appropriate positions, and do make sure the utensils do not nest together, this maycause bad performance. For a top quality cleaning, place the silverware in the basket making sure that:

- They do not nest together.
- Silverware is placed with the male face up.
- Long utensils in the middle.



Loading the Silverware Basket

The silverware basket could be divided into three separate modules that can be used in both upper and lower racks

- 1.Spoons
- 2.Knives
- 3. Salad forks
- 4.Forks
- 5.Large spoons
- 6. Large forks





WARNING

- 1.Do not let item extend though bottom.
- 2.Be sure nothing protrudes though bottom of the basket or rack to block the lower spray arm

Adding A Dish

To add or remove items after wash cycle starts:

- Open door slightly and wait a few seconds until wash action stops before completely opening.
- 2.Add the item.
- 3.Press the Start/C an cel
- 4. Close the door firmly to latch within 4s, then c ycle will automatically resume.



CAUTION

TO AVOID BURN INJURY: Slightly open door and wait until spray arms and wash action stop. Hot water may splash out of dishwasher. Failure to do so may result in injury.

Filling the rinse aid dispenser

Rinse aid greatly improves drying and reduces waterspots and filming. Without rinse aid your dishes and dishwasher interior will have excessive moisture.

The Heated Dry option will not perform as well without rinseaid. The rinse aid dispenser, located next to the Detergent cup, automatically releases a measured amount of rinse aid during the last rinse.

If spotting and poor drying is a problem, increase the amount of rinse aid dispensed by rotating the dial to a higher number. The dial is located under the dispenser cap.

If the rinse aid is low, the Rinse Aid light is illuminated at the beginning and end of the cycle indicating that it is time to refill.






Your dishwasher ids esigned to use a liquid rinse aid. The use of rinse greatly improves drying performance after the final rinse. Do not use a solid or bar-type rinse aid. Under normal conditions, the rinse aid will last approximately one month, try to keep it full, but do not over fill.




3.Y ou can adjust the amount of the rinse aid released during the rinse operation, the greater number indicates he larger amount of rinse aid released







Care & cleaning

Cleaning the exterior door and panel

1. Stainless steel panel

Clean the stainless steel door and handle regularly to remove the debris with cleaning soft cloth.

Do not use appliance wax, polish, bleach or products containing chlorine to clean the stainless steel door.

2. Control panel

Clean th e co ntrol panel with a light ly dampen ed cloth, clean it generaltly.

Clean the Stainless Steel Inner Door and Tub

The tub is made of Stainless Steel, it will not rust or corrode if the dishwasher should be scratched or dented.



Clean the spots on the steel inner door and tub with a damp nonabrasive cloth.

Clean the Cylinder Filter

The Cylinder Filter is designed to collect some bigitems such as broken glass, bones and pits.

The Cylinder Filter needs to be cleaned to maximize wash performance.

Remove the bottom rack, rotate the cylinder filter as shown, lift it out, empty and clean it by holding it under running water and replace.




Care & cleaning

Clean the Fine Filter

Take out the Cylinder Filter and remove the Fine Filter from the dishwasher tub bottom.

To remove the Fine Filter you must first re move the bottom spray arm as shown below.


Flush the Fine Filter by holding it under running water and replace.

Clean the door gasket

Clean the door gasket with a damp cloth to remove food particles regularly.




Air gap

If there is an air gap installed with your dishwasher, make sure it is clean so the dishwasher will drain properly. Air gap is not part of your dishwasher. Before you clean the air gap, turn off the dishwasher firstly and lift off the cover Remove the plastic cap and clean with a toothpick.

Inside

The inside of the dishwasher is self-cleaning with normal use. If needed, clean the tub gasket with a damp cloth and use a brush similar to the ones shown below to clean the opening in the end of the gasket.



Protect against freezing

Your dishwasher should be protected from freezing properly if it was left in an unheated place Have a qualified person do the following:

To Disconnect Service:

- 1. Turn off electrical power to the dish washer at the supply source by moving fuses or tripping circuit breaker.
- 2. Turn off the water supply.
- 3. Place a pan under the inlet valve.
 Disconnect water line from inlet valve and drain into pan.
- 4. Disconnect drain line from pump and drain water into pan.

To Restore Service:

- 1. Reconnect the water, drain and electrical power supply.
- 2. Turn on water and electrical power supply.
- 3. Fill both detergent cups and run dishwasher through a Heated-Wash cycle.
- 4. Check connections to make sure they do not leak.

Error Codes

When some malfunctions come on, the appliance will display error codes to warn you:

Codes	Meanings	Possible Causes
E1	Longer inlet time.	Faucets is not opened, or water intake is restricted, or water pressure is too low.
E4	Overflow.	Some element of dishwasher leaks .
Ed	signal responsion abnormal(happens when the problem lasts more than 20s, hint but not warning).	Signal error
E8	Failure of orientation of distributary valve.	Open circuit or break of distributary valve.
E9	Keep touching a button more than 30 seconds.	Water or something on the button.



- If overflow occurs, turn off the main water _ supply before calling a service.
- If there is water in the base pan because of an overfill or small leak, the water should be removed before restarting the dishwasher.

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTION S

Read the installation instructions clearly, and futher more, pay attention to the follow lists:

- 1.the power-supply receptacle for the appliance shall be installed in a cabinet or on a wall adjacent to the undercounter space in which the appliance is to be installed.
- 2.there shall be an opening through the partition between the compartments specified in (a) that is large enough for the attachment plug to pass through. The longest dimension of the opening shall not be more than 38 mm (1.5 in).
- 3.the edges of the opening specified in (b) shall, if the partition is wood, be smooth and rounded, or, if the partition is metal, be covered with an edge protector provided for this purpose by the manufacturer.
- 4.care shall be exercised, when the appliance is installed or removed, to reduce the likelihood of damage to the power-supply cord.

NOTE: A hose that attaches to a sink spray can burst if it is installed on the same water line as the dishwasher.

If your sink has one, it is recommended that the hose be disconnected and the hole plugged.
